I truly hope you all enjoyed Spring break. It was certainly good to have a few days off! Now.....

.we are back and ready to learn more and enjoy spring! Since March was a short month and the children really enjoy learning about the farm, we will continue our farm studies this month. It will tie in well with insects and flowers which is our topic for this month.

We have a couple of events this month for you to mark on your calendars. On Friday, April 14, we will have our Easter egg hunt. Each child needs to bring a dozen filled eggs (tape each one please) to hide that day. They will also need to bring their basket to hold them.

Then on Friday, April 21, we will have gardening and special person day. For all the first year parents, this is when your child invites a special person to come and plant flowers with them out on our patio. It can be you, grandparents, neigh-

bors......just someone special in their life. Everyone needs to bring some flowers for planting. Then they will enjoy a special snack and make a craft together. This can be done at drop off or anytime up to 10:00. There will be a sign up sheet on the door for things we'd like to have for this day.

You will also want to mark your calendars to attend May Day/Mother's Day program taking place May 1......first thing in the morning.....usually

around 8:30. This takes place in front of the school and every class performs a couple of songs, and then the older children perform the Maypole Dance. It's my favorite program of the year. You do not want to miss it!

Please check your child's extra clothing box. You might want to change the clothing out for the warmer weather.



Toddler News from Ms. Shannon & Ms. Dana

The April showers have shown up in a big way this week!! I hope you stayed dry and safe in the storms yesterday. This month as we prepare for gardening day we will talk about flowers and insects. We will talk about the different parts of the flower and what it takes to grow them. We will also discover the difference between an insect and a bug. The children will also learn to identify many different species of insects.

Our Easter egg hunt will be on April 14 at 10. You are welcome to come but keep in mind how your child does with separation if you don't want to take them with you after. We ask that every child bring in a dozen stuffed eggs that have been taped shut. Please don't send eggs stuffed with chocolate or anything else that may melt (also no candy that isn't prepackaged, ie. loose jellybeans). You may stuff the eggs yourself or buy the ones already filled. Please send those in with a basket or container to hunt with on Thursday. The Elementary kids will hide them for us on Friday. I will provide lunch on this day since the cost was figured into your toddler fee for the in-house field trip. If you would like to send in a special snack that day please let me know.

April 21 is Special Person/Gardening Day. On this day your child may invite

anyone such as a grandparent, aunt, uncle, or whoever they choose to come and plant a flower with them. I have window boxes that we will plant our flowers in. Each child should bring a flower or two that is happy in full to part sun to plant. I will put up a wish list of other things that the class would like to have-like potting soil, bird seed, bird feeders, etc. This is a great day. I've found that with toddlers it's easier to do this at drop off or as close to then as possible. So the best time is from 8-9:30. If you go much past 9:30 your toddler will be very anxious because everyone else has got to plant and they haven't. We will have a craft to do with their guests. They will also be able to share a small snack.

Just a couple of upcoming dates to make sure you have on your calendar for May: May 1 is May Day/Mother's Day and May 24 field trip to the Tennessee Aquarium. May Day/Mother's Day is a short program that starts at 8:30 should be over 9:30-10. Tennessee Aquarium field trip is a full day. Both toddler classes go so if you will be unable to go, you will have to make other arrangements for your child. More information will be coming


Thank you to Ms. Machida and Kanako for teaching the

We congratulate 5th years Zuhair Merchant and Ishan Sundrani for winning the Georgia River of Words Poetry competition

The River of Words Project is a program designed to help K-12 students understand their sense of place by studying a watershed in their own environment then expressing what they discover through poetry and art. The art and poetry is entered into a state-wide contest.

Georgia entries are judged by the Georgia Center for the Book and by the GA Environmental Protection Division.

About 50 poems and artworks are selected as winners each year in Georgia. Ishan and Zuhair will be honored in an awards ceremony held in Atlanta on May 7. .

The ROW Journal, a full-color printed booklet, is produced to showcase Georgia honorees. The winning works are also reproduced to become part of a traveling exhibit, hosted by the Georgia Center for the Book, which moves to libraries throughout the state. Another exhibit is also available for checkout to schools, nature centers, and other educational facilities.

We congratulate Ishan and Zuhair for winning this competition and becoming published poets! Also, thank you to Mr. Eric for working with these students and others, making sure their poetry was submitted for the competition.


Elementary News: Ms. Dolores & Ms. Nicki

We hope you have a Happy Easter and a wonderful Spring!!




News from Ms. Rebecca and Mr. Eric
