

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What an amazing little class Ms. Pam and I have!! The children are settling in and doing so well! They all sit on the line during our line time and really enjoy the stories I read and the songs we sing. At nap time they are all staying on their mats and doing a great job going to sleep. They are learning if they wake up early, to lie quietly on their mats until it's time to get up......great for such a young group! We feel very blessed this year.

We have had a good time learning about colors and shapes. These are ongoing themes that we will talk about on and off for several months. You can also help them with colors at home when you are dressing them talking about their red shirt, black shoes, blue shorts, etc. It's amazing how fast they will learn colors by doing this. Same thing with shapes really. The plate is shaped like a circle, your lunchbox is shaped like a rectangle. Things like this really help them to learn. We have also talked about grace and courtesy. Teaching them manners at a young age will stay with them always.

In September, we will learn all about the Zoo. We will talk about the animals and how the zookeepers care for them. We will learn several songs and also make lots of crafts (hopefully)!!

We go to the library every Tuesday morning. Your child checks out a new book each week as long as he/she brings back the one that they have had. It needs to be back by Tuesday morning in the little blue denim bag which we send home. Please talk to them about caring for the book. The children truly enjoy library time. Ms. Carol reads them a story and also shows them a short video on the theme that we are studying.

If your child goes home at 2:15, please remain in the lobby and let us bring them out to you. We don't want to upset the children waiting for their families when they see their friends' mommies and daddies picking them up. It's been a little hectic the first couple of weeks and we might run a couple of minutes behind, but things are getting better by the day. They are getting used to their daily schedules.

We have introduced several pieces of work to the children, and they are really enjoying work time. It's been mostly puzzles and "put and takes". They are also working on spooning (transferring from bowl to bowl), making bouquets and several other things. All these things use fine motor skills which are so important.

We have only received a few of the \$45 classroom fee for the different lunches, costumes, etc. If I do not receive everyone's by September 8, I'll just return the money back to the ones that paid and just ask for money for each thing individually. I just don't want to do part one way and part the other. It's absolutely fine with me either way. The payments are made to me please.

I fully expect this to subside pretty soon when they are fully normalized in the classroom. Several of you send a lot of variety which is great. It might be a good idea since you are sending so many things to send smaller portions. When we put their food on their plates they are very full. Please practice at home drinking from a cup. We use small bathroom size cups for milk at snack and lunch. There are several who spill because it's new for them. We still give their water bottles as an option to make sure they stay hydrated. If you have any questions about lunch, it's probably answered on the notes I sent home last week. Several children are coming in hungry. If your child doesn't like to eat as soon as they get up and you are arriving early to school, please feel free to send in a breakfast snack for them.

Thank you to all of you who have sent in your toddler fee. I'm sorry that I forgot to add that checks needed to be made out to me. I hope it wasn't too big of an inconvenience. The toddler fee helps me to be able to handle things for the classroom without having to burden the office with taking up money for the various things that we need during the year. Extensions to lessons are given when a child has mastered a piece of work, and they can then explore the work in different ways. Extensions to lessons happen in the cultural work and sensorial work. For example, one child was able to trace the largest broad stair and then pin punch it out. The children love to explore the work in all sorts of ways.






We have also begun sand paper letters for the year. If your child comes home with letters on their hands, this means they were doing sand paper letters. Please look at the letters on their hand and ask them questions about them. This is a great thing to do on the way home from

school. Start off by asking your child what sound the letter makes and then the two of you can try to come up with words that start with that letter. Sand paper letters are always an exciting time, and each child goes at their own pace when mastering the letter sounds. Please make sure to say the sounds of the letters with your child and not the letter names.


week to learn about hurricanes and discuss what is happening in Texas.

We have had an excellent first couple weeks of school. It's great to see that everyone has mud shoes and water bottles. The classroom schedule is sinking in and the children are enjoying review/new lessons. Our older students are doing an admirable job of helping out with the younger ones. We are all excited that Ms. Anna will be with us on Wednesday. Hopefully, most of you were able to meet her at the picnic.

Speaking of the picnic, it was great to see so many of you there. Know that the children were super enthusiastic about making the cards to put in your "Happy Box" (or whatever they chose to name it). The thought of a little card being able to put a smile on your face really motivated them.

Soon, your child will experience Maria Montessori's FIRST great lesson. There are 5 in all, so if they came home bubbling with excitement, know that there will be more to come. This month, in the afternoons, we will be studying the sun, the solar system, the atmosphere, volcanoes, land forms, living vs. non-living, and the five kingdoms of life.

Homework has begun to come home. Assignments of class work happen on Friday and everything is due on Thursday. If your child is ever having difficulty, please let me know via text or email before Thursday. Homework lab happens daily from 3:15 until 4:00 p.m. We also have time on Tuesdays, during the day, to assist with Spanish homework. Please go through your child's backpack periodically to help them with organization and to remove things that are not school related.

After another couple of weeks, we will have completed the Montessori normalization period, and we'll be looking for parent volunteers in the classroom. Anyone willing to help out with spelling, handwriting, math facts (flash cards) or cutting out materials, please let me know. We will also need a room parent to assist with some of our special events and to coordinate the classroom parties.

In October your child will be dressing up as a famous historical figure (deceased) and giving a short speech. We don't duplicate historical figures from the past 3 years of the Historical Timeline, so soon we will send out the list of people who have been chosen within the last 3 years. This performance works best when your child is curious about and interested in the character. We have many biographies in our school library and will be taking your children there in small groups. A schedule of deadlines will be coming home in the next couple of weeks.

My late afternoon is Wednesday, so if you ever need to have a private conversation with me about your child, I am able to stay until 5:30 p.m. Please make an appointment, as I may not stay that late unless a meeting ______ has been planned.
