






What we have been learning...

Classroom update...

The last month of the school year is here! Boy has time flown by! I want to thank each one of you for sharing your beautiful and curious child with me. It has been an honor to be their Lead Guide this school year. I hope you have enjoyed all the growth your child has made this year, I sure have! Your continued encouragement and support has been instrumental in your child's education. Your homework this month will be to play outside for an hour.:)

The artist of the month is Salvador Dali and his paintings of surrealism, modern art, and cubism.

The cultural area we will be studying this month is: Australia and all things that encompass that such as: culture, foods, living/non-living, plant/animal biomes, musical instruments, sentence reading, instruments, landmarks, flags, etc.

We will also be studying the parts of a butterfly, parts of a bee, parts of a kangaroo, and parts of a dragonfly.

Ms. Angie will be offering Tutoring (academic, social, continuity) this summer. If you would like to sign up an hyperlink to do so will be available soon. Cost is \$30/hour.

If your child has mastered all their letter sounds and uses a reader, over the summer, you are able to check out 2 books a week. This is on the honor system. I have a sign up sheet where we keep the readers (if you are unsure of where this area is located in the classroom, please ask Ms. Jamie or Ms. Angie and they will happily show you where). The order of the book sets are: Binders 1-8, then set M1/1A, then set 2, then set M2/2A, then set 3, then set 4, then set 5, then set 6, and finally chapters books. Below is a picture of what the sign up sheet looks like. Also, please have your child complete their workbooks over the summer. If you finished yours and need the next one, please see Ms. Angie.













Important Dates:

As we observe the afternoon work cycle and we often think about how fortunate we are to work with our current third-year students since they were three years old.

How their concentration level has deepened, their vocabulary expanded, their large and fine motor skills improved, and lastly, and perhaps the most importantly, their awareness of themselves – how they can take care of themselves and how they can help others, how they can contribute to the classroom community to make our room an even better learning environment for all of us. Children are ready for a break after working hard to finish their school year. Yet sometimes, pausing a well-honed learning routine can worry parents. Summer learning loss is a real thing; it refers to a child's regression in school skills, such as reading or math, that can occur over the summer break. While parents may continue with independent learning activities at home, it can feel tricky to continue them while travelling.

The good news is that summer learning can be adapted for the road, hotel room, or tent. The Montessori Method is a wonderful fit for things like outdoor learning and fostering independence.

The Montessori Method encourages the development of the whole child. In addition to strengthening their academic abilities, Montessori learning advocates for children's social, physical and emotional growth. Children are encouraged to be independent and to follow their natural curiosity. It's important that children can engage with their interests at their own pace, in a variety of settings. Since learning focuses on direct interaction with their world, children learn by doing.

If this sounds like the way a child may naturally approach being on vacation, you're correct. Exploring new places creates a wealth of learning opportunities for children. Taking a family trip allows for practice in new ways, too. How often does your child get to pack a suitcase?

There's also a palpable excitement in the air as a vacation draws closer that's ideal for your child's imagination. Vacationing in a traditional place your family is accustomed to visiting can trigger memories of routines only found on holidays, such as making s'mores around the campfire or swimming in the same lake. Meanwhile, a brand-new destination can encourage an adventurous spirit in children – anything from the local language to cuisine is a chance to explore and learn.







Montessori classrooms are designed to allow for large blocks of uninterrupted time for exploration. Your vacation can do the same. Maria Montessori prized unstructured exploration as the ultimate learning experience and noted that "free choice is one of the highest of all mental processes."

But according to the National Recreation and Park Association, unstructured outdoor play has <u>decreased by half</u> for children in the last 50 years. To put free time first, it's critical to avoid the desire to over-schedule your child.

More free time can make a family trip feel even more restorative. As a parent, you're asked to intervene as little as possible when it's time for discovery and play. Once you see your child focused and engaged in an activity, think of providing support as a way of encouraging them to go deeper.
