We then will focus on The Middle Kingdom (c. 2055-1650 BCE): the Kings of the 12th Dynasty, royal building projects, provincial cemeteries, the Coffin of Khnumnakht, towns and houses, sports and games, healthy Egyptian diet, medicine, magic wands, jewelry, The Myth of Osiris, Abydos and Egyptian Storytelling.
