It's finally here! We are so excited to share what we have learned with you on Thursday. I still have a few parents who have not sent in their \$5 for their costumes. On Thursday they should wear khaki shorts or pants and a white shirt. Our program will begin at 10:30 and we will have lunch afterwards. We still have some things that have not been claimed. We also need a couple of cases of water for the parents. Remember we have 21 kids in our class and they will all have family visiting so please keep that in mind when you prepare your food so we can be sure to have plenty for everyone. You can take your child with you after lunch if you like.

We have had children at school this past week and again this week who are not feeling their best. I understand that it is not easy to miss work when your child isn't feeling well but it's also not fair to the other children or teachers to send them in. I know a runny nose and cough don't seem like a huge deal but these children touch everything and put things in their mouths and they also are not very good or consistent with covering their cough so they are casting their germs all over the room. We do our best to keep the environment clean and germ-free but it truly next to impossible when they are all coughing and sneezing. This week, I really need my class and teachers well for International Day. Please consider taking your child to be seen by their pediatrician if they have a bad cough, thick mucus(especially green), and are just not acting like themselves. Rome is overrun with Covid, Flu A, and Norovirus at the moment. I am including part of the handbook for reference. Thank you for helping to keep everyone well!

If your child is observed to have any of the following symptoms by one of the teachers, you will be called to get your child from school. *Your child must remain out of school for at least 24 hours AFTER the symptoms have passed and when deemed well WITHOUT the use of medication. Your child MUST ALSO BE well (without medication) for at least 24 hours prior to returning to school, i.e.: if a student is sent home with a fever on Tuesday they cannot return to school until Thursday. This is to ensure the health and welfare of all students and staff.

- Fever of 101
- Influenza
- Diarrhea or vomiting
- Severe coughing
- Difficulty breathing
- Pinkeye

- Sore throat or trouble swallowing
- Unusual rash
- Severe itching
- Severe headache or stiff neck
- Lethargy

This list is also not all-inclusive. If a teacher observes that a child is not feeling well, she may at her discretion, ask that the child be taken home, even without any of the above symptoms if she feels that the child would be more appropriately cared for at home. If you are notified that your child is sick, you are expected to come and get them within an hour. If you do not, the school might be required to call the next person on your emergency list.
