

Many, many thanks for a super successful Thanksgiving feast. Hopefully your long weekend break was full of good food with extra helpings of family, friends, and fun.


December is here and that means holiday program. We'll be spending big chunks of time on arts, crafts, and music. The words to "Spoonful of Sugar" and
