




Thank-you to all the parents and students who attended the Open House last week. It was really helpful having you there to relay your experiences and perceptions to the par-


ents of the primary students. We will be hosting another Open House for the community on February 19. All are welcome to attend.

The Adolescent Class will be celebrating The High Middle Ages for International Day. We have spent the month of January covering this period of History in the classroom. The students are excited about sharing the highlights with the MSR community.


We will be going to the Carlos Museum in Atlanta at Emory University to further explore World History. Our date for this experiential learning experience is February 17th.

Grammar and Writing - We are working Monday, Wednesday, Friday on Grammar; this month we will cover "Phrases and Clauses." On Tuesday and Thursday we will cover writing mechanics utilizing our Literature and JGB readings.

History - This month we will be covering, "The Byzantine Empire and Russia (330 – 1613) & The Ottoman Empire (622 – 1629)." We will work on Monday, Tues-

day, and Wednesday on these areas and Thursday, Fri-

and preparation on Medieval for International Day. Literature- We enjoyed beginning our study of American author John Steinbeck and his work, The Pearl. We discussed the difference between this folk tale and the fairy tales we recently explored. A look at Steinbeck's biography impressed the students when they learned of his prolific writing career. This novella study will encompass much of the month of February, and then we will begin Steinbeck's The Red Pony as we further explore this great author. Writing essays in class will continue to be a focus of the literature class. I am impressed by the students' enthusiasm for reading these classic works of litera-



ture and by the depth of their critical thinking.

In chemistry, the adolescents will begin studying the structure of the atom and the arrangement of elements in the periodic table. In zoology, we will begin our study of Phylum Chordata, beginning with birds. We will also continue to dissect the phyla that we have already learned in class, starting with the arthropod.

In Geometry we are starting our adventures into logic, by interpreting conditional statements and transforming them. In Pre-Algebra, we are using formulae to figure out the dimensions of objects, like surface area, volume, and distance and midpoints of lines.
