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Adolescent News



Literature: The Adolescents just finished their major assessment on *The Pearl*. They are delving more into the works of Nobel prize winner John Steinbeck by reading his classic novel, *The Red Pony*. They have added 50 more vocabulary words to their repertoire --just ask them about legerdemain and disparagement!

On Friday, the adolescents went bird watching at The Eco Center, and will venture further

away for a longer bird watching trip during their ornithology studies this month. They will also focus on the study of mammals. In chemistry, they will learn about bonds, ionic and covalent.

Math: We are revisiting probability and exploring how odds work when it comes to real life applications, like the lottery and games of chance. Ask them what they think about the lottery and casinos! In geometry, we are using theorems and postulates to logically prove that



lines are parallel and perpendicular, and figuring out the measurements of related angles using the same logic. The students have to tell what AND why!

History: They had their assessment today on Chapter 13, culminating their study of ancient civilizations. Now they are taking a break from the book to do the section test. They are preparing the International Day skit with the help of Mr. Bob Harris, local historian. They will work on studying Mayan and Incan civilizations because during Spring Break, we are going to the Mayan Riviera and Tulum, Mexico on the Yucatan Peninsula.
