Thanks to the ones who were able to attend Daddy's Day! I know it was a very HOT evening, but I do believe it was a success......especially for the children! They love those inflatables.


We've talked a lot about colors and shapes.....read lots of books.....and sung our color song everyday. We will con-




Elementary News: Ms. Stefanie and Ms. Maggie



spelling. We also have a need for parents to volunteer to work with math flash cards and listen to readers. Ms. Annie plans to cook with the children every month, so let us know if you are interested and available to join us for this activity. We are also still looking for a room mom. If necessary, this job can be shared between 2-3 people.

Our class will celebrate late summer birthdays on Friday, September 9. The adults-in-charge of Yash, Ezekiel, and Newman need to coordinate and make decisions regarding a menu. Most of the time this is done with a full lunch, but sometimes with dessert-only; it's totally up to you. Lunchtime on Friday begins at 11:30.

The adolescents did a remarkable job presenting the 1st Great Lesson - The Birth of the Universe. We will be conducting gravity/inertia/centrifugal force experiments in the classroom throughout the next week. On Tuesday, September 6, they will be presenting the 2nd Great Lesson - The Coming of Life. As stated in last week's notes, this would be an excellent time to have a conversation about your family's beliefs about creation.

In order to make morning drop-off run more smoothly, please continue to drop-off at the main door between 7:30 and 7:45. After 7:45 the children travel to their classroom and the attending teacher will unlock the elementary side door (the same door we dismiss from in the afternoon). If dropping-off after 7:45, please pull up to this side door and watch your child enter the building. Changing to the side entrance will help with crowd control in the main lobby as the primary children begin to arrive.

We will have a presidential election in our lower elementary classrooms. Candidates will be any 3rd year students wishing to run. They will be permitted to post no-more-than three 8 1/2 x 11 sized posters in their own classrooms. Sometime in mid-September we will have our "primary" elections to narrow the field down to one candidate per class. These 2 children will then choose a running mate (any child) from the opposite class. Campaigns will begin in full force and last until mid-October. We will also elect a representative from each class (again no age-level restrictions). Once elected, these 4 students will have a monthly lunch-time meeting with the lower el teachers to present ideas for class-room enhancement: special dress-up days, service project ideas, etc. Further details will follow as more definite decisions are made.

Other reminders:

Some children still need an extra set of clothing. We have gallon-sized plastic bags to store them in.

Details about our annual Historical Timeline will be coming home next week. Begin talking about (deceased) historical characters with your child.
