Toddler News from Ms. Ginny & Ms. Pam


November was a fun month learning all about different types of transportation and also about Thanksgiving. I want to thank you all for all the great food you provided for our Thanksgiving dinner!


Elementary News: Ms. Dolores

The day after our program, Friday, December 8, will be pajama day. It can be a little chilly in the classroom when we first arrive, so please send them in their warm, comfy pjs.



