More importantly, they are exposed to the scientific method which is a great problem solving tool. Though not labelled as such, we adults use this method quite frequently... Tackling a problem or forming a question, coming up with an "if/then" hypothesis in our mind, and relying on background information or devising a plan to come up with a desired result. My sons remember every science fair project they did while at MSR and the older one still has more questions than a 2-year-old. What a relief that he now has the tools to answer them himself!

We've taken the tedious part of this assignment out of your home. We'll be building the science boards in class. Have fun doing the project with your child. If they sense excitement from you, it will really enhance the experience for everyone.
