want to use this at home. Two other apps that may be helpful (though not necessary) are *Montessori Math Add, Subtract* and *Montessori Math Multiplication* by *Edoki Academy*. Both apps have digital versions of Montessori materials that we use in the classroom.

We've had several cases of the flu in the primary and elementary classrooms. Please have a conversation with your child about washing hands, keeping hands away from his/her face, and covering coughs and sneezes.
