### Ms. Valerie and Ms. Christina's Class

We are excited to be learning all about the ocean. We will be talking about the seashore, seashells, ocean layers, and fun facts about the ocean this week. #### **Phonological Awareness**

We are learning a new sound every week in the classroom. Last week we learned the sound "c". This week the sound is "a". In Montessori we focus on learning the letter sounds before the letter names. We want to give the children a strong phonological awareness which is the building block to reading. We talk about words that start with the sound, read a book that emphasizes the sound, and we have work in practical life that is related to the sound of the week.

What is *Phonological Awareness*? It is the ability to notice, think about, and work with the individual sounds (phonemes) in spoken words. There is an abundance of research that shows having a strong phonological awareness is a key element to becoming a successful reader

It is hard to believe we have been in school for over a month now. We are so excited to share all the wonderful things that your child is doing in the classroom. We will start conferences next week. Conferences will be done virtually on zoom.
